



2012 INTERCOLLEGIATE SPORT REPORT

GENERAL

2012 was a year of strong challenges, both on and off the field, but one in which we have come through the better for it. Excellent contests were displayed throughout all competitions, with a few surprises thrown in. The event days associated with each sporting event continue to receive excellent support from the college community, with many volunteers called upon during the year. The logistics and operations of each event was pleasing, with no major issues experienced on the various match days. The Intercol community did face some significant challenges off the field in particular in regards to spectator behavior, which was managed by the Intercol committee, council and tribunal. Where 2012 tidied up the constitutional nuances associated with sporting events, 2013 will be a year in which the behavioral foundations laid in 2012 will need to be formalized. This will require strong support and leadership from the College committee representatives, house committees and heads of college.

Overall, the level of competition between the colleges was extremely strong. Congratulations to St Andrew's College for winning both the Rawson & Rosebowl competitions for the third year in a row. In doing so, Andrew's were victorious in all Rawson sports, and all Rosebowl sports except for Netball.

Other than the Rawson & Rosebowl sports, a number of social sports were played during 2012. AFL made a return after not being played in 2011, which was well received despite the weather. Touch Football was held during week 1 of Semester 2, which started the semester off with an enjoyable social competition. The annual SUCC XI v Intercol XI Twenty/20 Cricket match was won by SUCC, and Manning Bar hosted the Annual Intercol Boxing night.

Key to the ongoing success of the Rawson, Rosebowl and Social competitions are the continued support of the SUSF clubs, as well as the desire of the Intercol community for more participation opportunities on a social level. My recommendation would be to continue to promote these social competitions as they provide a great opportunity for the colleges to interact where winning is the not the main objective, as well as providing opportunities to those who would not usually be involved in Rawson or Rosebowl teams. Furthermore, competitions such as Touch Football provide a suitable alcohol free Intercol event.

Furthermore, the sponsorship by Cynergex of Intercol Sport for 2012 provided first aid support throughout the year, and represented a significant savings for the sporting budget. The sporting budget recorded a surplus of \$4000 which will be rolled over to 2013.

The year was rounded out with the Intercol Sports Dinner held at St Andrew's College. Apart from presenting the Rosebowl & Rawson Cups, the MVP of each sport was recognized, along with the Convenor, Sportsman and Sportswoman of the year. Camilla Phillips (Sancta Sophia College) was named Convenor of the Year for Tennis & Hockey; Crissy Grun (St Andrew's College) was named Sportswoman of the Year; and Cameron Patrick (St Andrew's College) was named Sportsman of the Year. St Andrew's College were also presented with the combined Rawson/Rosebowl plate for winning both competitions in the same year, which they have done now the last 3 years.

We can expect an exciting year in 2013, with a number of the sporting events hotly contested in 2012, as well as the hopeful completion of the SUSAC extension, to provide a new home for Rawson & Rosebowl Basketball.

Recommendations for 2013

- Continue with Cynergex as sponsor of Intercol Sport in 2013
- Consideration of different techniques for monitoring and disciplining spectator behavior at events, to be recommended and enforced by Intercol.
- Recommendation of minimum fines on colleges for breaches of the Alcohol Policy or code of conduct at Intercol events.
- Increased promotion of and opportunities for social and participation focused sporting events.

EVENTS



The start to the 2012 calendar was postponed with Day 1 of Rawson Cricket washed out. Otherwise, the remaining fixtures were unaffected with good support from the Paul's convenors and the umpires doing a good job. Umpire fees may need to increase in 2013. Recommendations

- The appointment of umpires through New South Wales Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association continues to be a great benefit for the competitions. Umpire fees will also need to increase in 2013.
- Delegating score duties to the 12th men remains the most reliable system of ensuring that results are recorded and scorebooks returned following games.
- Players to be advised of the appropriate behavior expected on and off the field.



The beginning of the Rosebowl calendar was managed well by Intercol with great assistance from the Andrew's Intercol and sports reps, as well as the Sancta convenors. We experienced issues with umpire consistency across the 5 days, but finished strongly. Night 4 brought 2 surprises, with Sancta upsetting Women's and John's upsetting Andrew's before going on to claim the first Rosebowl victory for the year.

First Aid & Security staff were on hand to ensure that everyone was well looked after and attended to. Intercol support on the day was effective, and the introduction of a Rosebowl VIII race saw Sancta finish 2nd behind a strong St Andrews crew. Andrews also won Rawson, ahead of St Pauls College.

We received reports following the event of some damage and trespass which occurred overnight. After several discussions with SIRC, the ongoing booking of the venue is subject to a number of conditions in order to ensure safety and protection to all competitors, spectators and the venue. There was also some damage caused by the Aquatic Service Provider we hired for the day.

Recommendations

- Staffing and officiating ratios are suitable with three boat race officials and the Intercol Committee assuming all officiating roles. The assistance of sports reps and senior students is essential for the supervision of spectators. SIRC continues

to provide excellent facilities and staffing support through security and event convenors.

- Have SIRC recommend Aquatic Service Providers.
- As outlined in the list of conditions provided by SIRC, it will be imperative that all spectators are transported by bus, and adhere to the code of conduct. No paint will be permitted, and Intercol and sport reps should be supported by senior students in managing the transport and supervision of spectators.

SWIMMING

Wed 9 May – Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre

The Swimming Carnival ran very well, due to all events running to time, and great cooperation from the colleges, with the committee very hands on during the evening. The officials employed as timekeepers and marshals were excellent, and the format of the night is very efficient. We rectified the issues with Diving scoring from the year before, which made points allocation much simpler. The only concern was access to the diving platform, with security not on hand to prevent them going up.

- Ensure security staff are stationed next to the diving platform, and enforce fines for anyone breaching the code of conduct.
- Allocate an extra Intercol member to the Diving competition, and provide an extra computer for diving results.

SOCCER

2012 saw the official introduction of Rosebowl Soccer. There were no lighting or logistical issues encountered this year, as all matches were scheduled to allow plenty of time, and the morning matches were not confined solely to Rosebowl matches. Soccer proved once again to be one of the closest fought events, and fortunately very few matches were decided by penalties. Andrew's won both competitions, ahead of St John's, who provided strong resistance.

Issues exist with the proximity of spectators to the players, with Intercol required to address some complaints made regarding spectator behaviour. Recommendations

- The by-laws in place are now clear, and should ensure no logistical complications.
- Enforcing the by-laws and code of conduct should be reflected in fines on colleges that breach the alcohol policy. Measures are required for colleges to monitor and control the behavior of spectators, especially those in close proximity to players.
- Appointment of competition officials/supervisors from an external body.

BASKETBALL

The Basketball competition was moved to SUSAC in 2012 due to the loss of HK Ward. The set up of the venue was very good, with adequate room for spectators and players, including the use of the grandstand. The majority of matches were played in the morning due to the move, which was well supported despite the time, however we will move back to the evenings in 2013. Both Rawson & Rosebowl were exceptionally competitive with a number of matches decided by 3 points or less. The final matches between Andrew's & John's (Rosebowl) and John's & Paul's (Rawson) were a couple of the most exciting matches this year across all Intercol Sport.

Recommendations

- Make clear in the by-laws how each quarter is timed (8 minutes fully timed – clock stops when whistle is blown; in the last 2 minutes of the last quarter, the clock stops after every basket scored)
- Move matches back to the evenings, and confirm whether grandstand is required
- Remind volunteers about their roles early
- Have someone assigned to court sweeping between quarters.

ATHLETICS

The final event of 2012 was held at Sydney Olympic Park, with another successful event with great support from the Intercol Committee. We faced issues with support from SOPAC and Athletics NSW, who were late in setting up the venue and providing all officials. The officials on hand did a great job, and ensured a smooth carnival. An additional jump official will be useful in future years. Andrew's secured victory in both events, and in doing so finished 1st in every event this year except for Rosebowl Netball.
