Modifications

Ratios

- For 'open' indoor soccer competitions, both males and females may compete with no set ratios of males to females on court
- For 'mixed' indoor soccer competitions, there MUST be a minimum of 2 females on court at all times

Team size

- Teams will consist of at least 5 registered players (max. 10)
- There must be at least 3 players on the court to begin a match

Match Duration

- Matches consist of 2 x 8 minute halves
- The length of matches may be extended for Finals games
- Extra time will include 5 minutes with golden goal rule applying
- If scores are still tied after extra time a penalty shootout will occur. Penalties will be taken from the center of the basketball free throw line as marked on the courts

Court boundaries

- The field dimensions are the same as for Netball i.e. 30m x 15m
- Keeper's boundary consists of the Netball goal area

Substitutions

- Unlimited, but must occur during a break in play

Referees

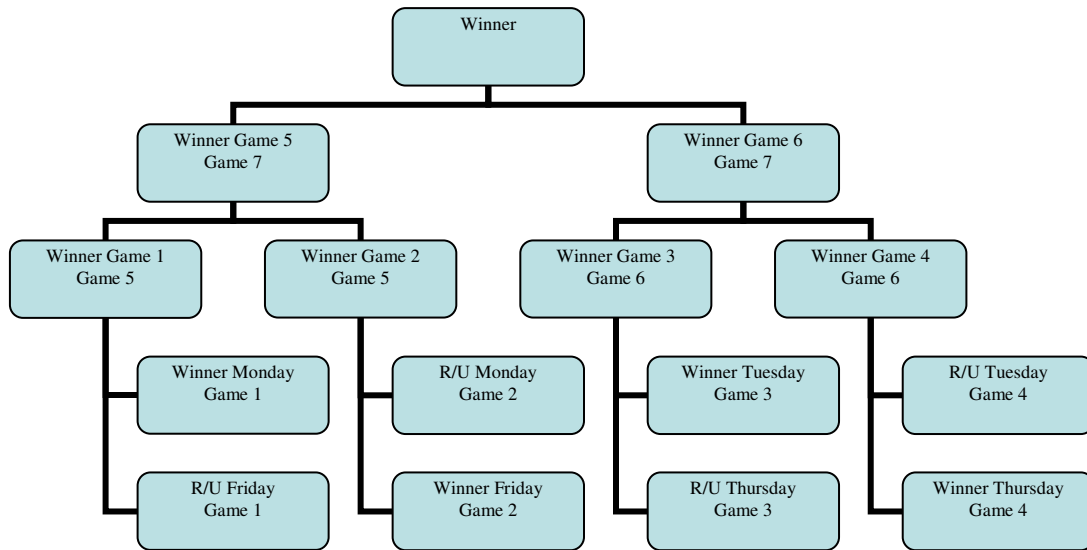
- During pool matches, one referee will be assigned per game
- In grand finals a referee and touch line referee will be assigned
- Referees discretion on calls will be final and any misconduct on decisions can result in offending players being asked to leave the court

Any abuse or gross misconduct directed at referees or other players will result in exclusion from the game, loss of deposit and possible suspension of the team from the competition.

Finals & prize money (Open Soccer Competition)

- After all normal rounds of games are played, the winners and runner's up of each day's competitions are determined through overall point score
- Each day's winners and runner's up will proceed through to play in a single elimination tournament to decide which team is the overall winner of the 'open' soccer competition. This final round tournament is played throughout Week 13 (see below for structure)
- The overall winner is awarded a prize from the Co-Op Bookshop and prize money. The overall runner up is also awarded prize money. *No other teams will receive prize money*
- The maximum amount that may be awarded to the winning team is \$200. The maximum amount that may be awarded to the runner up is \$100. Actual amounts awarded are dependant on the number of teams registered in the competition

Single Elimination Tournament Structure (Open Soccer Competition)



Finals & prize money (Mixed Soccer Competition)

- After all normal rounds of games are played, the winners and runner's up of the competitions are determined through overall point score
- The winners and runner's up will proceed through to play in a single elimination tournament to decide which team is the overall winner of the 'mixed' soccer competition. This final round tournament is played in Week 13.
- The overall winner and runner up are awarded prize money. *No other teams will receive prize money*
- The maximum amount that may be awarded to the winning team is \$100. The maximum amount that may be awarded to the runner up is \$50. Actual amounts awarded are dependant on the number of teams registered in the competition
